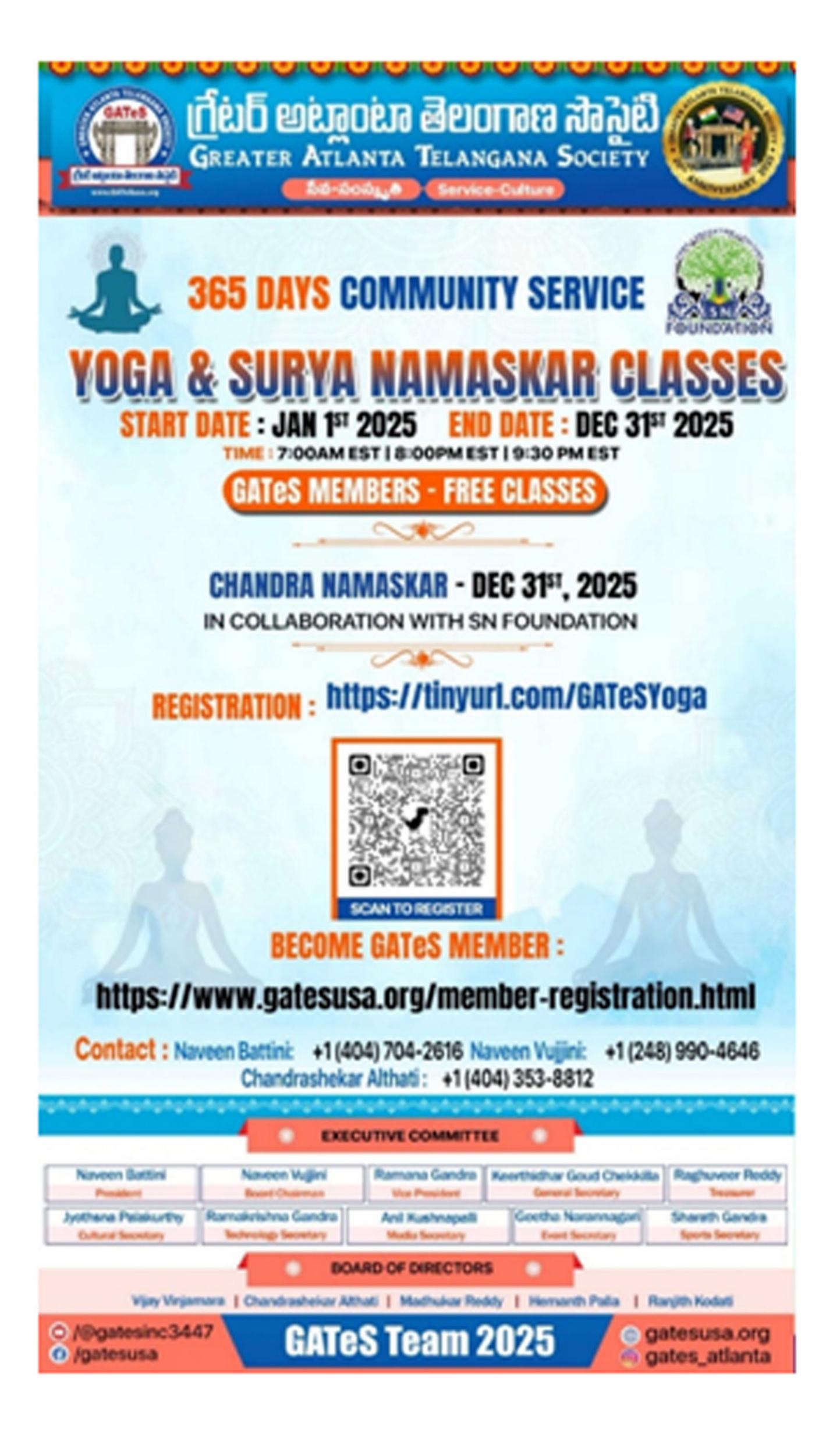


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#### Continued Yoga Classes at Greater Atlanta Telangana Society (GATeS)
